How to build a schedule for post-secondary

1. Log on to the Post-Secondary website and look for the Program you are planning on taking.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This is an opportunity to use various qualitative and quantitative research methods to prepare for graduate studies and advanced career opportunities within the criminal justice field.

After you graduate from UFV's Criminal Justice Bachelor program, you have gained the vocabulary and critical discernment to apply criminological and criminal justice principles to effect individual, community, and organizational challenges.




3. Once you have a list of courses require go to UFV Interactive Course Finder. Which is provided to assist in preplanning for registration. Select the desired term with the drop-down menu.


4. Go through each section in the search field and use the drop-down menu to find course looking to registrar for easier access.



5. Once all fields are entered you will come up with a search result. In this case for the summer semester the Crim 100 course is offered online. The CRN # you will need to write down for easier registration. The information for each course shows the dates of the course, the delivery (in this case online), credits, campus offered, and status.
