- 5. COVID Update
  - > Masks are mandatory at all times inside G.W. Graham
  - Large events are being limited to half capacity (160 students in our theatre).

  - Clubs are off to a great start with strong attendance throughout. Key Club had over forty students for their first meeting!
  - Football is off to an outstanding start with both the Junior and Senior Varsity teams winning out of the gate. The Senior Varsity Football Team beat the Kelowna Owls this weekend (27-23) and are now ranking 27<sup>th</sup> in the National High School Football Rankings
  - Theatre currently working on live streaming events and building a new GW Graham Newsroom
  - Music very pleased to be operating in a linear system rather than the octet system that we had last year. Our orchestra numbers are up this year (18 students), while other classes are about the same or had a slight decrease.
