The homeschool will use this information to make the appropriate placement for the 2023/24 school year.

		After successful completion of a Summer Learning Full Credit course, students will earn 4 credits towards graduation.

Grade 10 - 12 Full Credit Courses	10 - 12	Technology Explorations 10 Students will participate in a 2-week Carpentry course where they will learn the basics of Western Stick Frame Construction, Electrical and Plumbing. Then, students will complete a 2-week Welding unit where they will explore Oxy-Acetylene Welding, MIG Welding and Stick Welding.
		After successful completion of the Technology Explorations 10 course, students will earn 4 credits towards graduation.
		Open to students entering Grade 10, 11 or 12 in September 2024

Course	Grade	Description
English Language Learning (ELL)	9 - 12	This course welcomes any student whose primary language is not English; this includes newcomers to our community, international students, and those students currently receiving ELL support at their school.
· ,		This course helps students improve proficiency in all the English language domains, speaking, listening, reading, and writing. Students practice skills and strategies to increase their competency and command of the English Language with a focus on building Tier 2 vocabulary, academic conversation skills, comprehension, and fluency skills with the goal of working toward grade level reading and writing skills.
Transitions 9	9	This course is currently NOT open for registration.
Sustainable Vegetable Production	9 - 12	Students will be taught about food production through practical, hands-on experiences. Students will learn skills in land preparation, planning, weed control, pest management, fertilizing, pruning, harvesting, marketing and sales and culinary opportunities. Students will work alongside community partners who are specialists in the various commodities grown. Students will take food home on harvest days and be encouraged to prepare and eat the food grown with their families.
		Location: Sardis Secondary Farm (7175 Richardson Avenue)
		Dates: Tuesdays and Thursdays, July 2 - August 22
		Students must attend a set number of days out of 21 possible dates.
		Students must also spend time at home preparing food (or do additional days on-site).
		*All students must be in attendance Tuesday, July 2 nd for the Program Orientation and BBQ.
		Time: 8:00am - 2:00pm *Times may be subject to Change
		*Bussing will NOT be provided.
